Park Watch / Security:

Officer Tory Shields informed us that deterrence patrols have increased to 3 times per day thru the park. Graffiti was found at the main beach area, but was not considered to be associated with any gang activity. A citizen reporting an unlawful incident to police was very nearly cited for disorderly conduct himself when he became physically involved with the person he was reporting. Please report incidents, but don't get involved; let the police do their job. Officer Shields reminded us of a city-wide block watch meeting at 6:30 pm on June 1st at City Hall in the Common Council Chambers; and Coffee With a Cop on June 15th in the gazebo behind the Grobschmidt Senior Center.

There were no reports of mountain lions in the area, according to the DNR conservation warden.

Friends of Grant Park:

Treasurer's report: \$9,558.97 in our Park People account; \$3,896.12 in our Guardian Credit Union account. Total: \$13,455.09. A clarification was noted: Park People charges us an 8% administrative fee on *incoming* donations, not on our balance.

South Milwaukee Community & Business Association annual dues are paid thru October. Jan Marsh has volunteered to donate the dues again this year. Pam Uhrig will attend the May meeting. Please see Jody to volunteer to attend future meetings so that we can all participate.

Wulff Lodge Centennial Anniversary update: The South Milwaukee Municipal Band will play from 4 - 5 pm, playing songs from the '20s. The Boy Scouts are on board, too, and will conduct a flag retirement ceremony. Additional work days are needed to beautify the lodge and grounds, and are planned for the afternoon of May 20th, 22nd and June 3rd. Lend a hand if you can!

Debbie Pizur contacted YouthWorks, and their group of volunteer students will work in the park every Wednesday starting the 2nd week in June, 9:30 am to 3 pm. Rick Kaiser volunteered to supervise in June and Lynn Crawford in July. Work projects include pulling garlic mustard; litter; beach cleanup; burdock & buckthorn removal. Jan Marsh volunteered to collaborate with Annemarie Adsen and compose the text. It would be a great addition for our Wulff Lodge event in June.

A Grant Park Open "Club" house is planned for Thursday, Sept. 14th, from 6 - 8 pm, taking the place of our regular meeting. This would allow the public to see the remodeled amenities for future rental consideration. Perhaps our local historian, Nels Monson, would be available to speak.
