Root-Pike WIN: Urban Underground work days? We need to decide who will work with this group. We need to confirm dates when students would be available. Students work in the afternoon for about 3 hours. Could be combined with the YouthWorks group. Urban Underground group may be as large as 20 students. Will the groups be too large to manage? Jody to check out dates and how many adults will come with the group.

Fundraising: Calendar update; estate/rummage sale – Gannett "*Community Thrives*" grant opportunity. Group agreed they would be interested in working with Parks to write the grant. Rummage sale will be held in late July or early August. Calendar – Jody met with Sue, our graphic designer, and they have begun working on putting the calendar together.

Eaton volunteer day follow up – There were not as many Eaton volunteers as anticipated. Eaton people were prepared for many more to help. They plan to do it again. FOGP volunteers not needed to supervise much smaller group, so we worked in the park. We put a lot of work in preparing the event. Thanks to Pam, Rick & Betsy for scouting for work sites in advance. Since several Eaton employees admitted they had never been in the park before, it was suggested we offer a walk/field trip to Eaton employees or senior management. Do it over a lunch break, 11 am to 1 pm.

Safer Trek 'n Treat on October 10th – 1 to 4pm? Group agreed to go ahead with the event. We may need to rethink refreshments. Volunteers needed to make it work :15 adults, 30 high school students needed for stations. Apply to Costco for treats. If we wanted to raise cost this would be an appropriate time.

New business – Brian Russart will be moving boulders off the beach. Current drought conditions may cause some loss of trees that were planted earlier this year. Parks planted gardens for the rusty patch bumble bees in Warnimont. Facebook has some new policies.

Idea – Post more signs to keep people off the eroded beach slopes. We do have more signs, but the consensus is that signs will not work in that location.

New Blinds for Wulff Lodge delivered to Sean. Should we volunteer to put up blinds? Rick will follow-up with Sean. Annemarie and Debbie volunteered to take on this job.

The following Sunday, June 13th, join us at Area 5 for **Suburban Soles** guided nature hike at 10 am. Our tour guide will be Julia Robson, Waukesha County Parks Conservation Biologist. The topic? **"An Ode to Odonates"** - Dragonflies & Damselflies.
