Treasurer Report – please see attached report. We have started to pay for the step project. The project may cost a bit more than anticipated but we have enough money to cover in our treasury.

YouthWorks Report – Last day of work was July 28. On average there was 10 to 25 volunteers. The kids and adult chaperons worked all day Wednesday and Thursday mornings for 10 weeks. There was a total of 95 volunteers which worked 460 hours for FOGP. Thank you to the city of So. Milwaukee for providing t-shirts to YouthWork volunteers.

Fall WeedOut – emphasis for this fall will be cutting tree lilac and buckthorn. Two park employees will work 2 days to cut down tree lilac rather than girdle. Cutting is better than girdling. We appreciate Parks for making staff available and will donate \$400 to Parks that was earmarked for this work from grant funding already received.

Fall WeedOut dates: Sept. 24; Oct. 1, 8, 22 and 29.

Tree Planting - planting will happen in late October. All trees will be fenced to stop deer from grazing on them. Rick has requested 15 - 20 UWM students to volunteer for community service hours. Students may lack transportation. If you are available to provide transportation to/from UWM, please contact Rick or Jody. Rick also contacted Marquette for student volunteers.
